~ New VelaShape II[™] Laser: Lose Inches and Reduce Cellulite – without Surgery ~

Contour has added a new laser to its arsenal of advanced technology for cosmetic enhancements, giving you an important new – and non-invasive – option to help you reshape your body and look your best.

The VelaShape II is the first FDA-cleared laser of its kind for both circumferential reduction (the medical term for losing inches) and reducing cellulite. The laser's combination of radiofrequency (RF) energy, infrared light, suction and mechanical massage increases metabolism in the body's fat cells and stimulates lymphatic drainage. And it works.

"Patients are seeing a reduction of several inches in problem areas such as the thighs, outer hip, abdomen, love handles, saddlebags and buttocks," Dr. Jochen says. "And they're also experiencing smoother skin that improves the appearance of cellulite."

"I'm on my third treatment and I do see a change. Even my husband says he sees a difference. I don't know how many treatments I will need, but the cellulite is disappearing," states Karla Teapila.

The VelaShape II treatment feels like a warm deeptissue massage. Typically, four to six treatments are recommended, spaced about a week apart, but patients can determine when they're satisfied with the results they see. Each treatment lasts about 15 minutes per area. Most people experience no side effects, but some may exhibit short-term, localized skin redness. "For patients who have cellulite or need to lose only a few inches, the VelaShape II could be a complete solution for their body-sculpting needs," Dr. Jochen notes. "And due to the skin-tightening effects of this laser, it's also an excellent comple-



ment to liposuction for those patients who need more significant removal of fat tissue."

He stresses, however, that neither the VelaShape procedure nor liposuction is a substitute for a healthy diet and regular exercise.

"But when stubborn fat deposits won't respond to dieting and exercise, we have options to help people achieve their body-contouring goals," he adds.

~ Love Those Lasers! ~ How CO₂ lasers work their magic

"I see a big improvement and I'm very satisfied," says Robert Shea, referring to the results from the fractional CO₂ laser treatment for facial rejuvenation he underwent at the beginning of the summer. "I see a significant before-and-after difference."

Shea, a 74-year-old patient from northern California, wanted to "tone up" his skin and turned to Dr. Jochen for help. A former fighter, Shea char-

acterizes his skin as tough. "I used to wash my face with 20 Mule Team Borax," he admits. He also was seeing the skin laxity that comes with age.

"Today there are dozens of different types of lasers used for cosmetic procedures," Dr.

Jochen explains. "The major difference among them is their wavelength, or the color of the light they emit. The wavelength can be targeted to a specific type of skin tissue, leaving surrounding skin unaffected." The laser (which stands for light amplification by stimulated emission of radiation) works by generating energy that vaporizes or removes unwanted skin tissue, or stimulates the new growth of collagen in the skin.

To meet Shea's skin rejuvenation goals, Dr. Jochen recommended the UltraPulse[®] Laser from Lumenis and its Active FX and Deep FX applicators to deliver the Total FX treatment. The UltraPulse[®]



is a versatile fractional CO₂ laser that produces results in a single treatment. Contour's Fraxel® system works in a similar way, but takes three to five treatments.

"The human body is mostly water, and the CO₂ laser's light is absorbed in any tissue containing water – making it the ideal laser for skin resurfacing and tightening," Dr. Jochen says. The new-

> est type of CO_2 laser is called "fractional." It sends tiny columns of energy down into the skin so healing occurs faster (instead of ablating a large area of skin like traditional CO_2 lasers).

"I had less than a week of

downtime after the Total FX procedure," Shea says.

The CO₂ laser also stimulates the growth of new collagen in the weeks and months after treatment. "My skin just seems to get better with time," Shea notes. "The Total FX gives you a lot of bang for the buck."

How the treatment works

Like other pharmaceutical sclerosing agents (the medical term for this type of injectable substance), Asclera is injected into an affected vein where it irritates its interior walls, causing it to constrict and close. This prevents blood flow and can eliminate the swelling, bulging, discomfort and discolor-



ation which can be caused by small varicose veins or spider veins. Asclera is best suited for treating varicose veins of 1 to 3 millimeters in diameter, or spider veins less than 1 millimeter in diameter.

What to expect

Before the procedure, the treatment area will be thoroughly cleaned and a topical anesthetic may be applied to numb the injection site. Asclera itself has anesthetic properties, which helps

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make treatment more comfortable. For most patients, and depending upon the number of sites being treated, the entire procedure takes about 30 to 45 minutes.

Most patients are able to return to their regular routines soon after treatment (a compression stocking may be prescribed to enhance healing) and will see results after one to three Asclera treatments.

~ Know Your Nails ~



Nail disorders affect many older adults because as we age, our nails thicken and become more susceptible to infections (especially fungal infections). Circulatory problems and medication use also tend to increase as we get older, which can

boost the risk of developing a nail disorder. Here's a look at some common nail conditions:

Fungal infections (medical term: onychomycosis) – These are more frequent on toenails than fingernails. They often begin as a white or yellow spot under the nail tip; as the fungus spreads, it can cause the nail to discolor, thicken and crumble. Treatment can include oral medications, an antifungal lacquer, topical medications, even surgery.

Bacterial infections – The most common cause of a bacterial infection is injury to the nail or surrounding skin, or frequent exposure to water or chemicals. Symptoms include redness, swelling and pain. Antibiotics (oral or topical) are necessary to clear it up.

White spots – Usually caused by a mild injury, white spots eventually grow out and aren't cause for worry. If you suddenly see several white spots and don't remember injuring your nail, however, it could indicate an infection or other medical condition (especially if the spots don't grow out).

Splinter hemorrhages – These appear as a reddish-brown vertical line that looks like a splinter. Usually caused by injury, certain medications or medical conditions can also cause them. **Mucinous cysts** – These appear as clear, jellyfilled pimples at the base of the nail, and can be painful and damage the nail. Cyst removal is the recommended treatment.

Warts – Warts are viral infections that affect the skin around or beneath the nail, and can be painful. Treatment involves freezing or applying chemicals to destroy the wart.

Dark spots or streaks – If such a spot or streak appears and is not the result of injury, see me. This could be melanoma, a very serious form of skin cancer.



Nail ridges – Vertical nail ridges (running from cuticle to nail tip) are common and often more prominent as we age, but they're not a health concern. If your fingernails change color or develop horizontal ridges, see me or your primary care physician – this could signal underlying health problems such as respiratory disease, malnutrition or even a heart attack.
